IMPROVING ENTREPRENEURSHIP SKILLS IN THE SOCIALIZATION ENTREPRENEURIAL PROGRAM YEAR 2024 STATE POLYTECHNIC OF SRIWIJAYA

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Abstract

Entrepreneurship education plays a crucial role in fostering innovation and empowering future leaders in today's dynamic economic landscape. This paper delves into Socialization Entrepreneurial Program conducted at the State Polytechnic of Sriwijaya in 2024, aimed at nurturing entrepreneurial skills among students. Through a comprehensive analysis of the program's implementation, sharing sessions, challenges, and participant feedback, this study provides insights into the efficacy of entrepreneurship education initiatives. The program employed a hybrid approach, blending webinar sessions with coaching activities, to disseminate knowledge about entrepreneurship and guide participants in engaging with the program effectively. Various challenges encountered during implementation were identified, and recommendations for future enhancements were proposed based on participant feedback. The findings underscore the positive impact of the Entrepreneurial Program in instilling entrepreneurial interest and facilitating skill development among students, highlighting the transformative potential of integrating entrepreneurship education within academic institutions.

1. INTRODUCTION

In the contemporary global landscape, entrepreneurship stands as a cornerstone for economic growth, innovation, and societal advancement (Abhijith, 2021). As an effort to cultivate entrepreneurial spirit and enhance entrepreneurial activities to encourage college graduates to become job creators, the Student Entrepreneurship Program (Program Mahasiswa Wirausaha - PMW) has been developed as part of the entrepreneurship education strategy in higher education institutions (Suwena, 2016). However, it is seldom found that a graduate wishes to embark on an entrepreneurial journey upon completing their studies. The failure of such endeavors is purportedly due to a lack of earnestness in entrepreneurial pursuits and a failure to recognize the inherent potentials within students (Yulikah et al., 2021). Identifying the entrepreneurial potentials of students can be assessed through six aspects: personality, self-discipline, creativity, drive/desire, willingness to face risks, and self-confidence.

In an endeavor to foster a culture of entrepreneurship and stimulate entrepreneurial activities among college graduates, the Student Entrepreneurship Program (PMW) has been formulated as an integral component of entrepreneurship education within higher education institutions (Setyobakti et al., 2022). Nonetheless, the inclination of graduates to venture into entrepreneurship post-graduation remains scarce. This dearth in entrepreneurial endeavors is often attributed to a lack of earnest commitment towards entrepreneurial pursuits and an inherent failure to recognize the latent potentials residing within students (Yuliana et al., 2022).

This paradigm shift is particularly evident in the initiatives undertaken by the State Polytechnic of Sriwijaya (Politeknik Negeri Sriwijaya), where the integration of entrepreneurial programs has become a focal point in shaping the academic landscape. Amidst this backdrop, the Entrepreneurial Program at the State Polytechnic of Sriwijaya in the year 2024 marks a significant milestone in nurturing the entrepreneurial spirit among its students.

Entrepreneurial Program serves as a precursor to delve into the multifaceted dimensions of the Entrepreneurial Program, elucidating its objectives, methodologies, and anticipated outcomes. By exploring the symbiotic relationship between entrepreneurship, education, and societal advancement, we aim to shed light on the transformative potential of integrating entrepreneurship within the social fabric of academic institutions (Jamali & Kreidie, 2014). 3. METHODOLOGY

The Community Service Activity was conducted by the Career Development and Entrepreneurship Unit with representatives from nine departments in State Polytechnic of Sriwijaya participating. The event comprised webinar sessions and entrepreneurship coaching, with a focus on providing "Successful Entrepreneurship at a Young Age." The choice of the PMW-themed webinar aimed to assist participants who already harbored aspirations and interests in entrepreneurship in realizing their business ideas by utilizing the funding opportunities available through PMW. Essentially, igniting entrepreneurial interest and encouraging individuals to venture into entrepreneurship can be cultivated through educational and training activities focused on entrepreneurship The execution of this initiative involved delivering insights into the Socialization PMW program to participants through online webinar sessions and providing coaching to ensure their success in engaging with PMW activities on this Year. This activity was conducted in a hybrid format, with some participants attending in-person sessions at the Career Development and Entrepreneurship Unit while others joined remotely via Zoom Meetings and in Graha Building State Polytechnic of Sriwijaya.

The activity's procedural steps, as outlined in Figure 1, began with a comprehensive dissemination phase aimed at ensuring broad participation from stakeholders. This involved the distribution of informational materials, such as event flyers, across various channels including student associations, social media platforms, and departmental networks. Subsequently, the execution phase commenced with the conduct of hybrid webinar sessions, facilitated by knowledgeable speakers who provided valuable insights and strategies for engaging with the Entrepreneur Program 2024. Following the informative webinars, participants actively engaged in socialisation coaching sessions designed to refine their entrepreneurial ideas and proposals for submission. These coaching socialization sessions provided a platform for participants to receive personalized guidance and feedback from mentors as a source of information, fostering the development and enhancement of their entrepreneurial initiatives. The activity culminated in an evaluation phase, where feedback mechanisms such as questionnaires and observations were employed to assess the effectiveness and impact of the socialization efforts in instilling entrepreneurial interest and facilitating participation in the Entrepreneur Program 2024.

Additionally, it encourages early registration due to limited seating, particularly highlighting that the first 15 registrants from each department will have the opportunity to

attend the event offline. Overall, the flyer serves as a concise and informative tool to attract participants and communicate essential details about the PMW socialization event.

Based on the results of the Participant Questionnaire from the Socialization 2024 Entrepreneur Program (refer to Table 1), it is evident that the program has been positively perceived by participants across various key aspects. The questionnaire revealed that 80.80% of participants felt that the socialization of the Student Entrepreneurship Program aided in their understanding of entrepreneurship concepts. Additionally, 79.20% of respondents found the socialization activities to be effective in providing them with new insights into business opportunities. Moreover, 76.40% of participants expressed increased confidence in developing business ideas after participating in the activity. The questionnaire also indicated that 79.20% of respondents agreed that the material presented in the socialization was easy to understand, while the same percentage felt highly motivated to start a business after participating in the socialization activity. Furthermore, 79.60% of participants acknowledged that the socialization activities helped them recognize practical steps in starting a business, and 79.20% reported an increase in their knowledge of

financial management after participating in the activity. While 76.40% of respondents felt more prepared to face challenges in the entrepreneurial world post-activity, the same percentage found the activity highly effective in providing opportunities for collaboration with fellow students. Lastly, 76.40% of participants believed that the activity significantly contributed to the development of their entrepreneurial skills. These findings underscore the effectiveness of the Socialization 2024 Entrepreneur Program in fulfilling its objectives and highlight areas of success that can be leveraged in future program iterations to further enhance participant satisfaction and skill development.
